SHOULD I GET MY PET PREGNANT?

If your pet is already pregnant, you may skip this chapter if you'd like, but the information here might still be valuable to you.

It's known that pets were originally meant to carry children, but nowadays many have different purposes. People use them for recreation, companionship, sexual relief and even as decoration. Still, if a demon wants to have children, the most common way of achieving that is impregnating their own pet.

That, however, has it's downsides.

First of all, it will **permanently** alter your pet. A pet angel who has never been pregnant will typically have a slightly different body shape. Although this may be more noticeable on pets who have less body fat, it does affect them all regardless.

After their first delivery, their bodies will "understand" that they are fit for breeding and, in turn, will change accordingly. Most of these changes are internal but some are still visible to the naked eye. Notably, they'll likely store more body fat in their bellies and their hips will widen. This serves to protect their wombs from any outside impact and to make birthing easier, respectively.

Sometimes the extra fat will show on their thighs and arms as well, but it's likely just a side effect of womb protection. There also significant change to their breast tissue, but that can be easily reversed with minor surgery if the owner desires.

While yes, they're very small changes, it's good to know there in advance. It's the only way you can make a truly informed decision! There are also possible behavioural consequences, but those will be discussed later. Because of these factors, some people get themselves a pet just for reproduction so they don't risk the ones they're already attached to. That's something to consider as well.

Second, and most important, a **pregnancy is a very serious commitment**. Remember, there are actual children inside your pet who will most likely grow up to be **people**, not pets. It's your job as an owner to look after them starting at conception! That can usually be solved with IVF, but it's something to keep in mind if you intend on doing this naturally.
